30th Anniversary of Queen Silvia of Sweden's Visit

Thirty years ago, on April 13, 1988, Queen Silvia of Sweden visited Bryn Athyn. Two years earlier, Carroll Odhner's husband, Rev. Dr. J. Durban Odhner, had been the keynote speaker on Swedenborg's birthday at the Swedish House of Nobles in Stockholm.

At the banquet, Dr. and Mrs. Odhner were sitting with Lars Bergquist, a prominent Swedish diplomat and member of the Scandinavian Swedenborg Society. The discussion turned to a trip to America that the King and Queen were planning to celebrate the 350th anniversary of the establishment of New Sweden, a colony founded in the area now known as Wilmington, Delaware.

Dr. Odhner wondered if it might be possible for them to

visit Bryn Athyn at the same time, to dedicate the new Swedenborg Library building. Mr. Bergquist thought it was a great idea and proceeded to show Dr. Odhner how to write an official letter to the Royal Court. The surprising reply stated that the Queen had accepted the invitation! After two years of extensive preparations, the Queen arrived in Bryn Athyn.

After leaving the helicopter which had carried her to the College campus, Queen Silvia and her entourage made their way through the enthusiastic crowd which had gathered to catch a glimpse of her. She proceeded into the Library and down to the Swedenborgiana & Archives Reading Room, which was full of fortunate people who had received personal

invitations to the event. After an official welcome by representatives of the General Church, Academy of the New Church, and Bryn Athyn Borough, Queen Silvia unveiled a plaque and proclaimed, "I inaugurate this library in memory of the contribution to mankind by Emanuel Swedenborg, a great son of Sweden."

After the Library visit, Bishop and Mrs. Louis King walked with the Queen to Bryn Athyn Cathedral for a quick tour and then on to Glencairn Museum to see the building and have a chance to meet some members of the community.

From there, Queen Silvia returned to her helicopter waiting on the Glencairn lawn to carry her back to join her husband, King Carl XVI Gustaf, for a gala affair in Wilmington, Delaware.

Carroll's Corner: Swedenborgiana

This past month, Carroll was pleased to have the opportunity to present an overview with slides of our special collections on Tuesday, February 13 at Cairnwood Village. Marvin Clymer helped prepare the images of our treasures. Carroll gave examples of the research questions that frequently come to her from all over the world.

The New Church Special Collections in Bryn Athyn College's Swedenborg Library provide the very foundations on which the New Church is based. The library is home to the largest collection in the world of books, documents, and images relating to the New Church, and is composed of Swedenborgiana, New Church Literature, and the Archives.

The Swedenborgiana collection contains copies of Emanuel Swedenborg's

original manuscripts, first and all subsequent editions of Swedenborg's theological writings, and more. The New Church Literature collection documents the church that grew based on these theological writings with New Church books, journals, newsletters, pamphlets, liturgies, and hymnals. Finally, the Archives offer a personal perspective, with photographs, letters, and documents related to the history of the New Church, the General Church, Bryn Athyn College, the Academy of the New Church, and the Bryn Athyn Church and community.

These collections are the world's primary repository for New Church thought and history and serve as a critical resource for New Church education. They fulfill a purpose explicitly stated in the Academy of the New Church Charter for "establishing a library." They

also serve a critical use in the academic research of scholars in Bryn Athyn and around the world. Requests for research in 2017 alone have originated from Sweden, France, Ukraine, Italy, United Kingdom, and Canada, as well as across the U.S.

Staff members preserve and maintain the collections, and process, catalog, and store incoming material. They also work diligently to digitize the collections, making the information easy to search, share, and preserve. Their work is critical in not only saving these works for the future, but also enabling them to be shared and utilized, spreading the work of **Emanuel Swedenborg** farther and faster than ever before.
