Academy Yearbooks in the Library


The first Academy of the New Church yearbook in 1923 was called the Boys' Academy Year Book and focused primarily on the activities of the Boys' School. *The Year Book of the Academy* Schools appeared in 1927 as The Voice of the Campus, representing the Boys' Academy, Girls' Seminary, College and Theological School. Yearbook design gradually evolved over the years with the first color photos appearing in 2008. The production and size of yearbooks have varied widely, based on the economy, wars and school finances. The class of 1952 was the last class to graduate without a yearbook. While yearbooks became

established as a tradition in the Academy high school, they did not catch on in the College. Early yearbooks included the College since it was largely an extension of the high school: occupying the same buildings, sharing teachers and known as the Academy of the New Church College. The College created just 4 yearbooks, from 1984 through 1987. Now a four-year college, perhaps the yearbook idea will be reborn here.


As windows into the academic and social life of the Academy, yearbooks have been collected for many years by Swedenborg Library. The best copies are stored in a climate-controlled vault for preservation. Additional copies may be used in the Library and many can be checked out.

To aid preservation and provide greater access to the Academy yearbooks, the Library began a digitization project in 2009 to scan yearbooks for the Charter Day reunion classes each year. All 86 yearbooks produced by the Academy and the College, from 1923 – 2019, can now be found online in the Swedenborg Library New Church Digital Collections at www.swedenborglibrary.org/ digital Select Archives > Academy of the New Church > Yearbooks. Look under Bryn Athyn College for college yearbooks.

Several events in June will highlight the Collections. We will be hosting a tour and exhibit for the Off the Left Eye Experience attendees on Sunday, June 7 from 3-5 pm. The conference theme is Presence of Heaven and will be held on the Bryn Athyn College campus from June 5-7. We will also be giving a presentation on the New Church Collections along with an exhibit for the General Church Retreat, June 18-21. Its theme is Behold I Make All Things New. In preparation for these events, Rev. Andy Dibb and I are working on a new exhibit on Swedenborg's preparation by the Lord during six stages of his life, using books from Swedenborgiana to illustrate this preparation.

On the right is an image from one of the books in the exhibits: *Captoptrum* Microcosmicum by Johann Remmelin (1583-1632), printed in Augsburg by Davidis Francki, 1619. This is the first work of anatomy to publish images in threedimensional views, by using layers of cross-sectional images as a series of flaps that one could fold back to reveal deeper levels of anatomy. Surviving copies of this work are exceedingly rare. Our copy has all the original three-dimensional images. This title is one of the books in Swedenborg's personal library that illustrates his deep study of anatomy during the 1740s. - Carroll Odhner
