

### *Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science*

The College requires 124 credits<sup>1</sup> for graduation, in addition to satisfying the Core Program (see pp. 29-31). On the satisfactory completion of these credits, and with the recommendation of the faculty, the degrees of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science will be granted. Majors are offered in Biology (B.A. or B.S.); English, History, Interdisciplinary Studies, and Religion (B.A.); and in Education (B.S.). Students interested in the B.A. or B.S. degrees should interview the appropriate program advisor as early as possible. B.A./B.S. students must spend at least two years (60 credits) in residence (see p.12 Residency).

When students have completed six terms at the College, it is expected that they will be ready to enter a B.A. or B.S. program. If students wish to continue in the College without declaring a major and are in good academic standing, they may continue for a maximum of one term in **General Upper Division Study (GUDS)**. During this term, students should apply for admission to a B.A. or B.S. program or make other plans. Those students not enrolled in a baccalaureate program will have low priority in the awarding of financial aid.
